## **(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC)**

### **ORDER 2020/C19/009**

NOTICE is given that Cambridgeshire County Council intends after twenty eight days, to make an Order pursuant to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, using The Traffic Orders Procedure (Coronavirus) (Amendment) (England) Regulations 2020, the effect of which is to stop any vehicle from proceeding along various roads, as set out in Schedule 1 below.

Nothing in this Order shall prevent access and egress from premises or land adjacent to the highway mentioned in Schedule 1.

The proposed Order is necessary to facilitate the reallocation of roadspace to support social distancing and continued modal shift due to the Coronavirus emergency and it will come into operation on 7 September 2020 and continue until the measures are no longer required or on the 6 March 2022 whichever is the earlier.

The Order shall not apply to any member of the Police Force, Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service, a vehicle being used by Special Forces during the execution of their duties or to any person acting with the permission or upon the direction of a Police Officer in uniform.
